Ahmet Alibašić is Assoc. Professor at the Faculty of Islamic Studies, University of Sarajevo teaching Islamic culture and civilization courses, and director of the Center for Advanced Studies in Sarajevo. Topic covered during the program: Survey of Islamic History.




EHLIMANA MEMIŠEVIĆ
