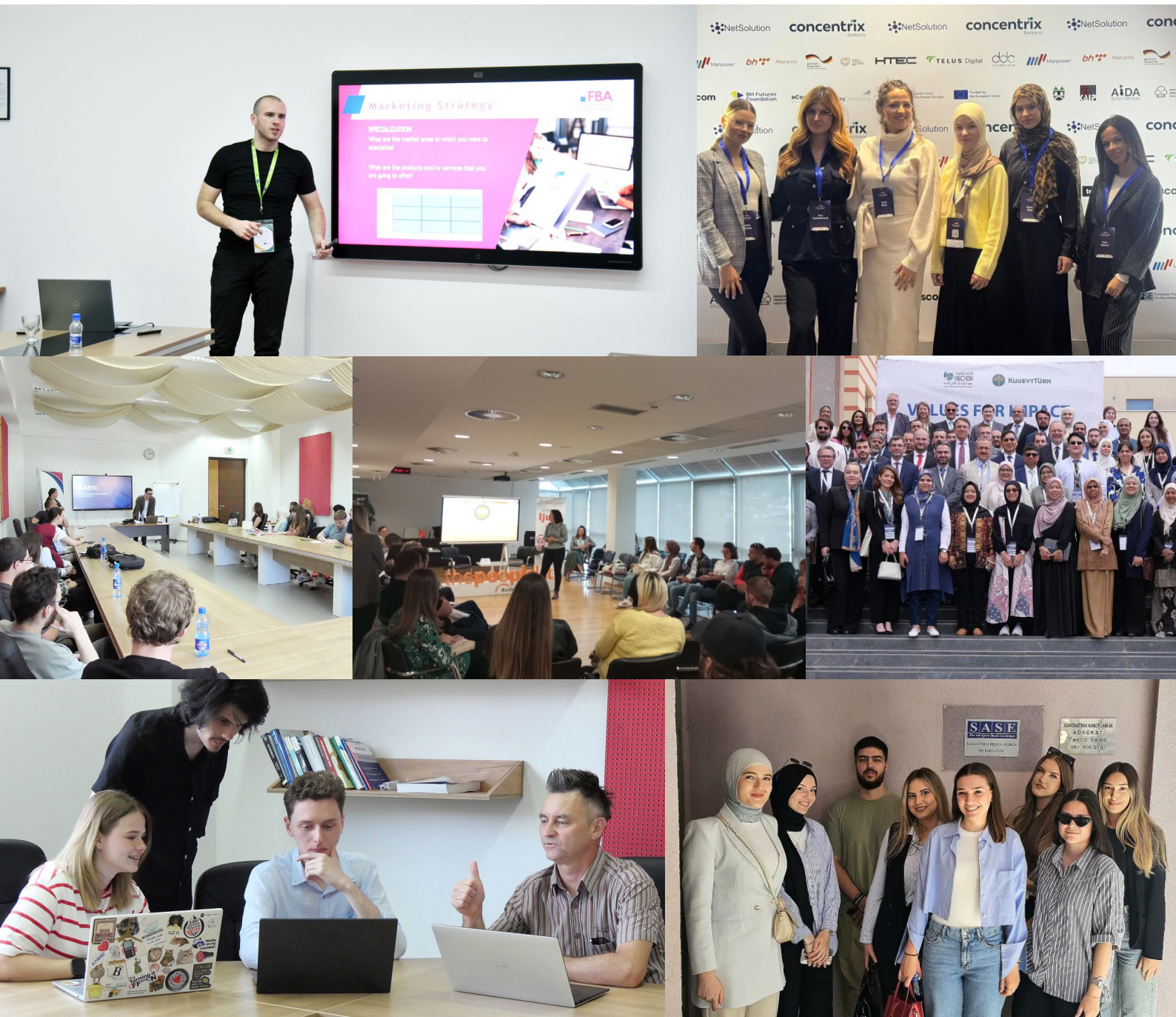
# STUDENT SUPPORT
